- MSF tasked RGIT Montrose to develop generic course



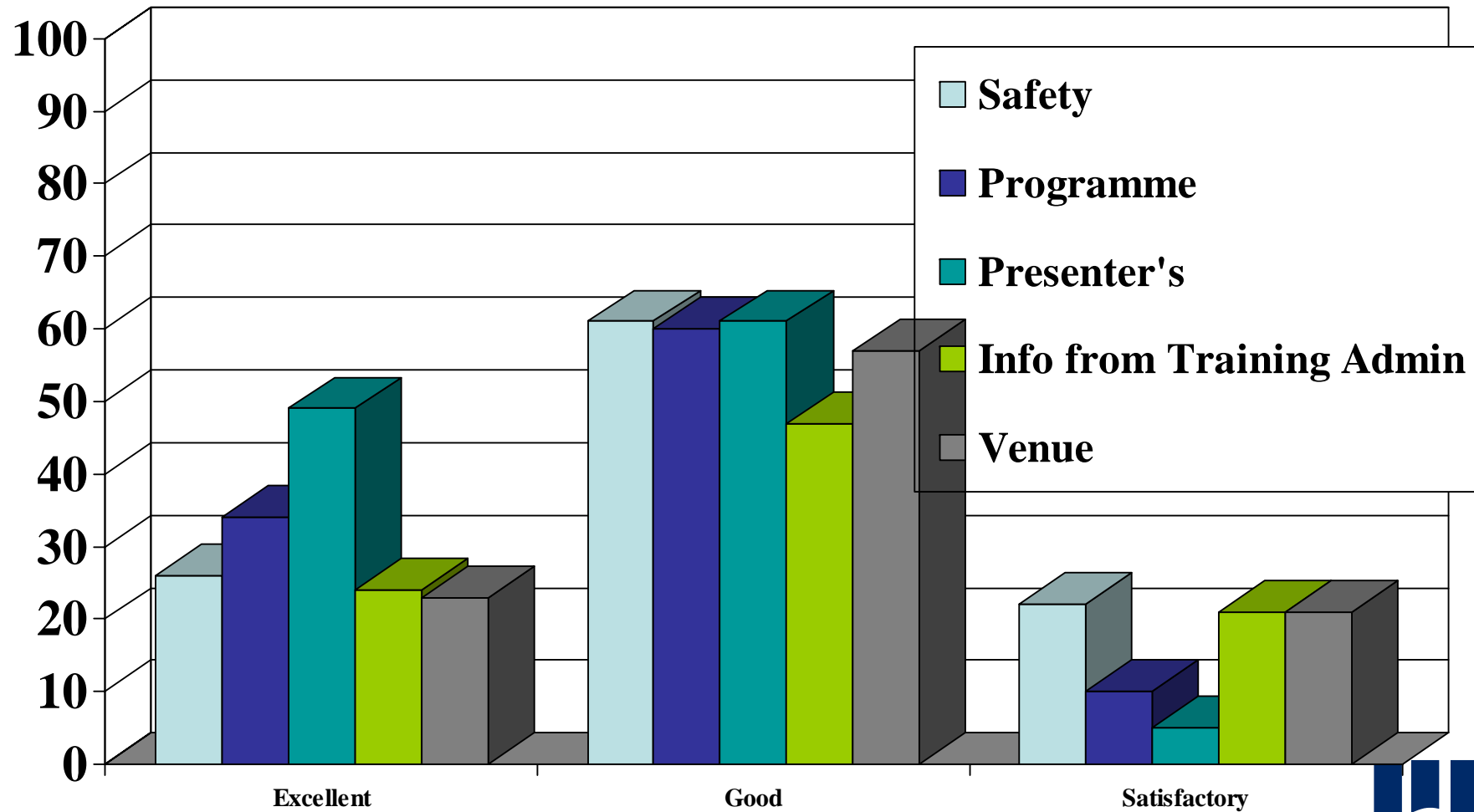

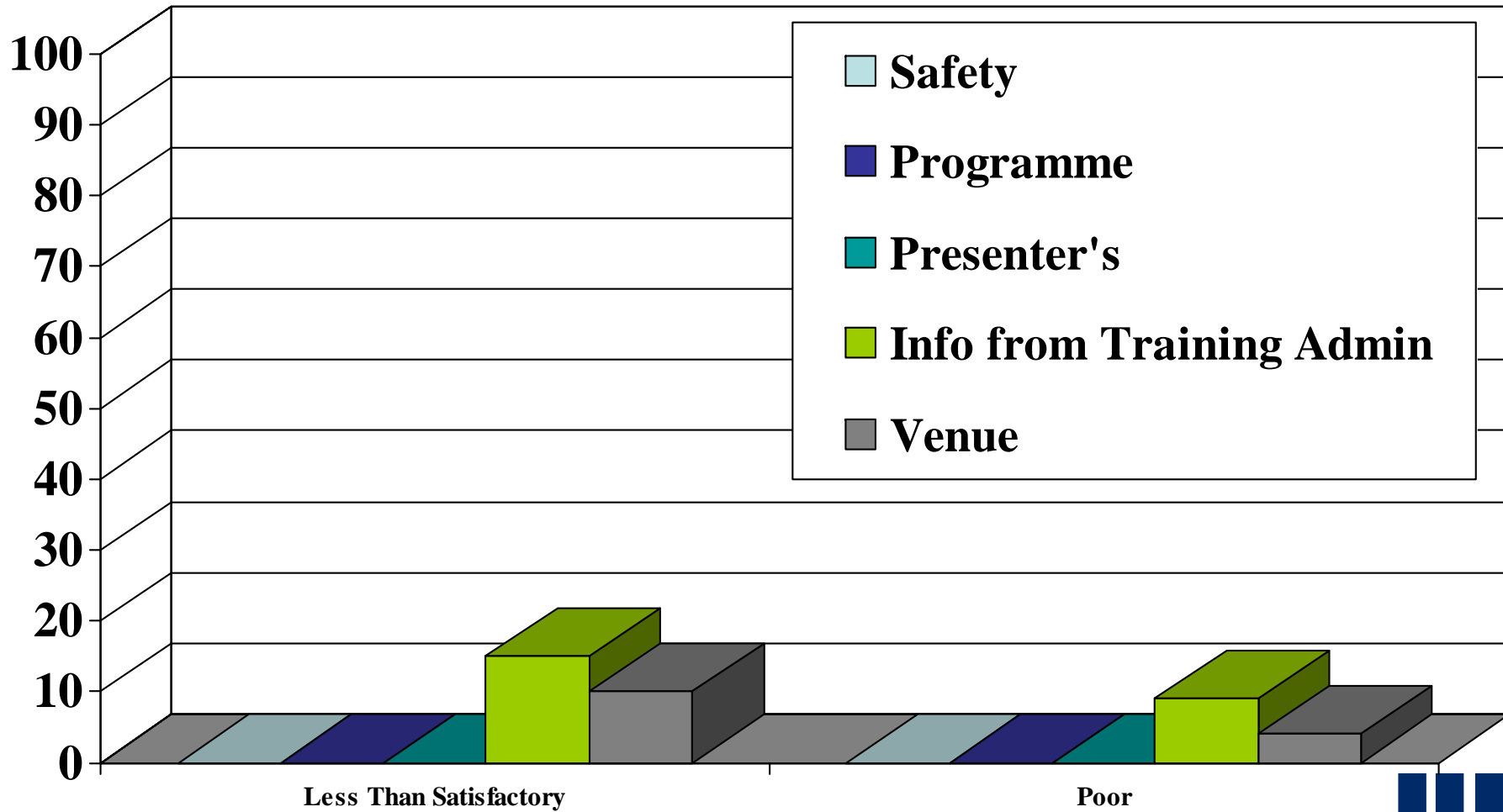

# Delegates Feedback Shown as a Percentage



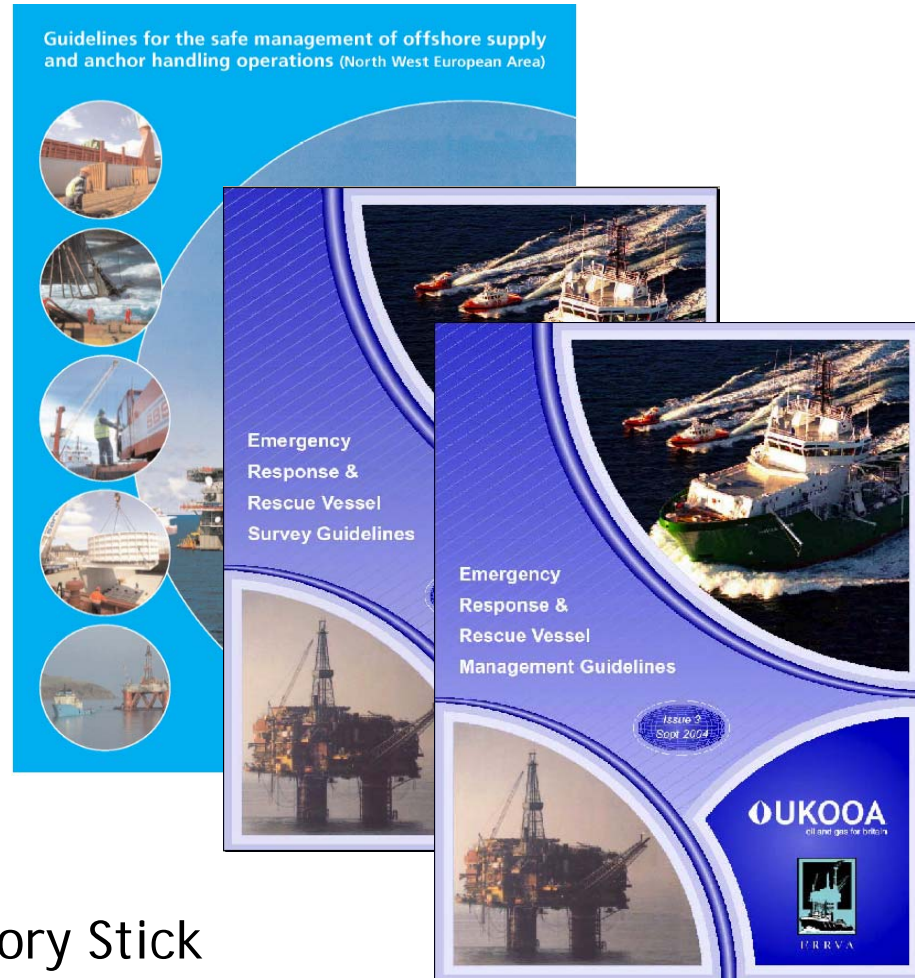

### Course Overview

This course is intended to refresh and update knowledge and awareness of marine operations in connection with offshore installations. The course is recognised and endorsed by the Marine Safety Forum.

### Course Structure

Delegates will take part in discussion and group exercises supported with a workbook. The course includes visits to onshore supply base and aboard a PSV. A written assessment must also be completed.

### Prerequisites

Delegates will be assumed to have completed Dangerous Goods by Air and Sea Courses, and GMDSS Short Range Certificate or VHF Restricted Operators Certificate. They may also have attended the Waste Management Course.

Delegates should also be able to demonstrate a basic understanding of weather forecasts and terminology, and of the management and application of platform deck loading areas to cargo ratio. An awareness of crane and supply vessel working limits is also required.

Some pre-course reading is recommended. A reading list will be issued with the joining instructions.

### Target Audience

Personnel who have responsibility for or are engaged in marine operations in connection with offshore installations, in particular STL/PSS/OSC/Deck Foremen, their reliefs and possible successors.

### Course Content

The syllabus focuses on:

- Bulk loading operations
- Clarification of roles/responsibilities of STL/PSS/OSC
- Dangerous goods
- Overboard discharges
- Planning, communication and contingency
- Relevant standards/procedures/guidelines
- Vessel types
- Visit to onshore supply base and shipboard visit

### Certification

A certificate will be issued to delegates who successfully complete the course and the written assessment.

### Revalidation

Every 3 years.

### Venue

Course venue will be advised at time of booking. Overnight accommodation and meals at the venue are included in the course fee.

Delegates must bring practical clothing and safety footwear.
