The Programme for 2007 & 2008 – Workgroups

Retain the 4 Work groups, no new initiatives:

Asset Integrity: Senior management education workshops, Q1; KP3 sharing, SC website enhancement, KPIs review, Engineering Technical Authorities involvement

Competence: Include in VANTAGE, determine minimum safety standards, include asset integrity/major hazards

Visible Leadership: Company MDs to promote visible Site Leadership via OIMs, promote more effective safety committees, revisit original Charter

Control of work: ISSOW common training, HSG250 compliance & ‘golden rules’, common PTW?

Publications: Well Services Guidance, Coaching for Safety booklet



Way forward in 2008

- New Co Chairs : Rick Cohagen, Chevron & John Methven, Petrofac
- Governance: Board support for Step Change to continue with new funding model and with enhanced commitment to deliver on the Vision
Leadership Team to increase to 30 Managing Directors
- Retain Temple Vision & Strategies: but work new metrics, including aviation and marine incidents
- Retain the 4 Work groups, no new initiatives
- Best practice sharing: The HSE & Companies to do much more engagement, site visits cross Duty Holders (not audit), concerted focus on sharing events, awards for best practice sharing



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Way forward in 2008

- HSE Partnership: HSE to share data but also to maintain positive tension with the industry. Post inspection meetings with senior management
- Benchmarking: statistics to be shared within Leadership team with offers of support to those companies not performing so well
- Step Change Engagement: improved Trade Association involvement, meetings – share fairs / network meetings building on success of last one plus individual OIM, ESR, Liaison meetings, Offshore Industry Advisory Committee (OIAC) & workforce involvement
- Support Team: review make up of team – fulltime Oil & Gas UK team members v secondees, involvement with Oil & Gas UK and other trade associations



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Way forward in 2008

- Summary: no place for talking shops if we are to have any chance of delivering on the Vision.

Renewed commitment, signing up to charter, energy and passion to make a Step Change but:

if we keep doing what we've always done,.....

you know the script - and we'll never achieve the Vision!

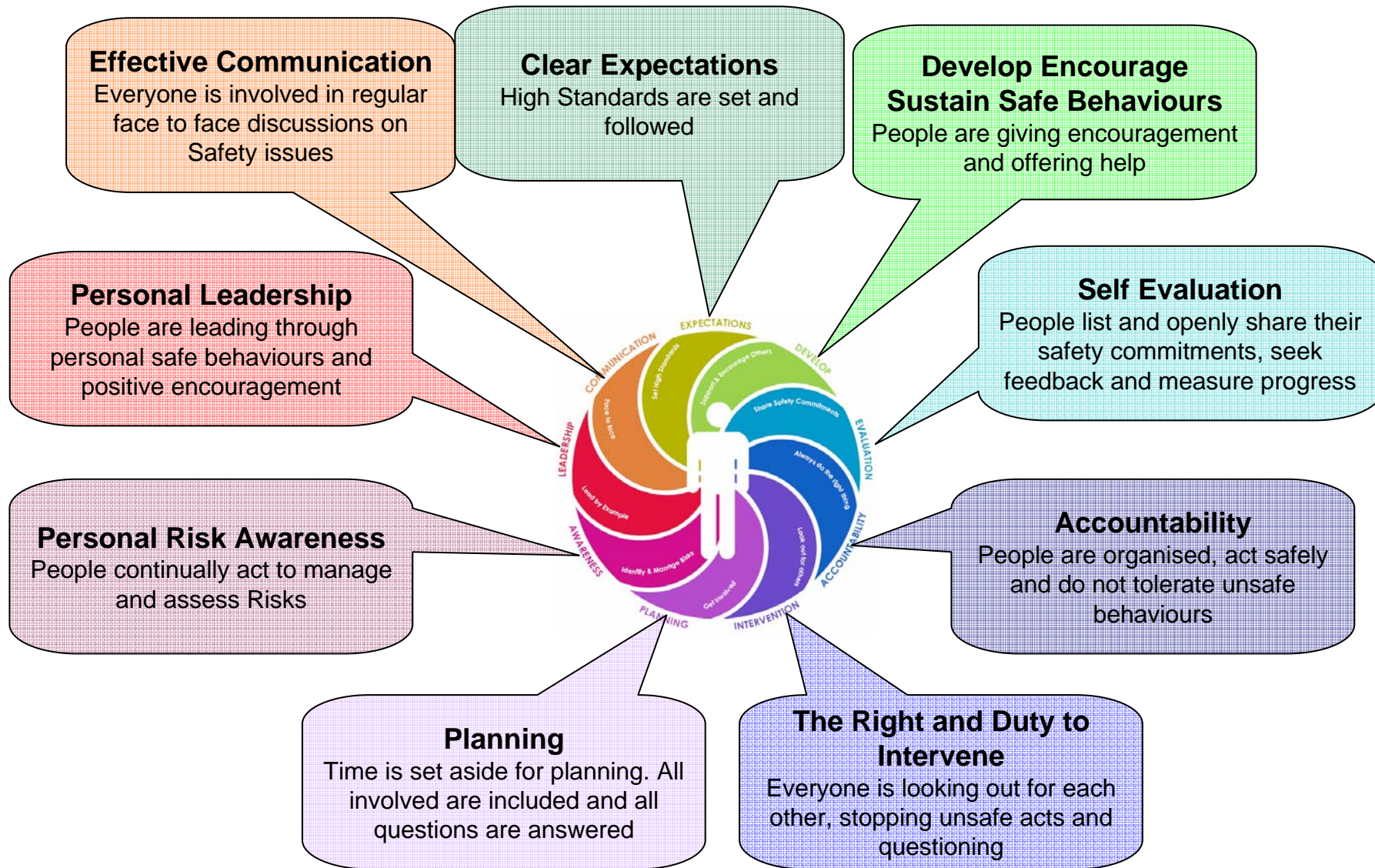
